





IATA Cargo Handling Manual – ICHM 2021

- → Book and plan shipments, pick them up from the shipper
- Receive freight at the forwarder branch and transfer it to the forwarder hub

- → Prepare export shipments
- → Transfer shipments to and receive shipments from the carrier domain,
- → Accept shipments as ready for carriage and prepare for transport
- → Send shipments to the flight and distribute information
- → Unload and dispatch shipment to warehouse
- → Check-in and arrive shipments, transfer shipments to forwarder
- Load truck and produce run sheet, deliver and obtain proof of delivery

- → Major impact on cost, facilities and staff training etc on airports/Airlines/GHAs globally
- → EU ACC3/ RA3/KC3 programme What is it?

Revenue streams for GHA's, ramp handling, import cargo handling, export cargo handling and security screening

→ Working smarter and better to achieve an improved bottom line rather than throughput generation of cargo, unless together with the airline they can offer a market advantage.



Changing strategic approach to cargo in order to keep high-yield cargo

- → Avoiding loss of business to the express operators
- → Opportunities to improve the processes to avoid delays and reduce the time cargo sits on the ground at airports
- → Work in partnership airports airlines and ground handlers to reduce costs, grow business and speed up delivery & maximize revenues
- → Development opportunities for airports when working with airlines

Adopting change in cargo operations:

- → Economies of scale, productivity improvements, efficiencies from technology improvements, specialist product handling, customs integration
- → Ground handling companies are pressured for reducing fees
- → Electronic distribution needs to continue to move at pace.
- → Airports need to support industry with closer working relationships with government agencies such as Customs.
